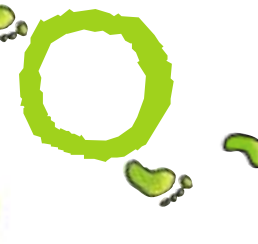

Dear Children,

do you like riding your bike or scooter? Many journeys are very exciting when you go on foot too.

You can see funny and interesting things or meet friends - and it is good for our environment! During the activity week you can discover what you can do for the environment yourself.

All journeys you make without a car are eco-friendly and give you one Green Footprint.

Children all over Europe collect these Green Footprints. We need 28 029 Green Footprints all together!

This is the amount of kilometres we need to travel from Brussels in Belgium via Kyoto in Japan to Milan in Italy.



In Milan will be a very big conference at the beginning of December. There many politicians from all over the world meet to discuss the environmental and climate problems of our Earth. We want to show these politicians that kids in Europe already do a lot to protect our Earth!

28 029 Green Footprints, that's quite a lot! If all of you collect only five footprints during the activity week, we'll make it!

We will make a big event at the conference in Milan, where all Green Footprints will be handed over to the European Commissioner for the Environment.

Join in! Show the "big ones" in Milan how much the "little ones" are doing to save the world's climate. If we all help together we'll make it!



Rules

Try to walk or take a bike, scooter, bus or train as often as possible for your journey to school or kindergarten. Put your Green

Footprints into this album each day: one for your journey in the morning and one for your journey back home.

If your parents gave you a lift, use one of the put a red car instead.

You can collect Green Footprints at the weekend too! Those days you can draw your type of transport. Look for the picture of where you went at the weekend (e.g. sports field) and draw the type of transport you used to get there next to it.

Of course, you could also use a sticker if you have one! Or you can exchange with other children - and you can also draw the place you went to if it's not already in the album!



Painting and handcrafts

If the activity week is over you can make your own Green Footprint.

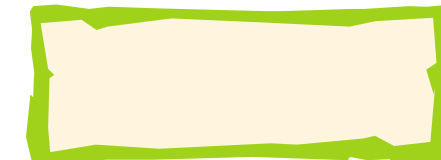
Stand on a piece of paper and draw around your foot. Then cut out the footprint and colour it in. Blue and green like the globe or multi-coloured - anyway you want! Write your ideas and suggestions for the politicians on it too!

Your teacher will send the footprints to us (or upload them with you on the Zoom website at www.zoom-europe.org). We will take them all to the Conference in Milan. There we will hand them over to the European Commissioner of the Environment!
