



Join EUSEW 2008 as an organiser of a decentralised event

The European Sustainable Energy Week relies upon the active involvement of local communities and energy actors

European Sustainable Energy Week (EUSEW) is the key annual reference point for sustainable energy issues in Europe.

Following unprecedented collaboration between the European Commission and a wide array of private and public actors in 2007, the second EUSEW will take place between 28 January and 1 February 2008. The first EUSEW brought together more than 5,000 experts and decision-makers who attended over 30 events in Brussels, Murcia, Grenoble and Wels.

This time round, over 47 stakeholders have already submitted their proposals to organise events in different European cities. The European Commission's Directorate-General for Energy and Transport wishes to integrate new initiatives by local communities and energy actors under a common umbrella with the aim to strengthen the overall objective of raising the awareness of both policy makers and the public with regard to sustainable energy sources and energy efficiency.

"Energy Policy is not only about legislation, but also about communicating, hearing, and bringing together all stakeholders. With the European Sustainable Energy Week, the Commission leads the most willing stakeholders to undertake together a real European energy revolution", said Energy Commissioner, Andris Piebalgs.
